Article 5 provides the standards for developing and using a property including density and lot dimensions, environmental and open space standards, landscaping and screening, parking and access, and infrastructure standards.

Article 6 provides building design requirements for multi-family and townhome residential buildings, non-residential buildings with special provisions for industrial buildings, and Town Center district buildings.

Article 7 brings the Town of Mineral Springs into compliance with the Reed vs. Town of Gilbert, AZ, US Supreme Court ruling that sign regulations need to be content neutral in order to uphold the First Amendment of the United States Constitution. All signs are either exempt (incidental, historic, or murals), temporary, permanent, or prohibited.

Article 8 provides for the continuance or discontinuance of nonconforming uses, structures, development sites, and signs.

Article 9 is intended to define terms that are vital to the interpretation of the Ordinance.

Specifically, some of the changes involved included removing the Downtown Overlay, which was in place for certain areas in downtown. The removal of the Downtown Overlay was replaced with the new building design standards for non-residential properties. In coordination with removing the Downtown Overlay, a new Town Center zoning district emerged with slightly elevated building standards.

At the Town Council meeting and public hearing on July 11, 2019, the council approved the Mineral Springs Development Ordinance with the associated zoning map amendments, which become effective on July 12, 2019. Just prior to that adoption, the council reviewed a list of specific amendments that needed council discussion. Those decisions are as follows: Continued on page 2

- The Board of Adjustment will now hear Special Use Permit (formerly Conditional Use Permit) requests instead of the Town Council hearing them.
- The Board of Adjustment and the Planning Board will not be combined and will continue as individual boards.
- Drive-through restaurants will still not be allowed, ٠ farmers markets will be allowed in the R20 zoning district with a Special Use Permit, and all retail over 3,000 square feet will require a Special Use Permit.
- One shed of up to 144 square feet will be permitted on ٠ a property of 2 acres or greater without a principal structure.
- Banguet and event facilities will be allowed on proper-٠ ties of 10 acres or more, but are not allowed in subdivisions with 10 or more lots.
- Two rows of parking will not be allowed in the front yard of non-residential buildings, as previously regulated.
- Overflow gravel parking areas are permitted in the rear yard of non-residential properties when all required parking spaces are paved for .
- Trucks over two axles will be allowed to park in the ٠ side or rear yard overnight in residential neighborhoods.
- Non-residential properties will be allowed to have one (1) feather flag/shark fin sign per property.
- Daycares accessory to religious institutions or schools are permitted to have more than 25 attendees.

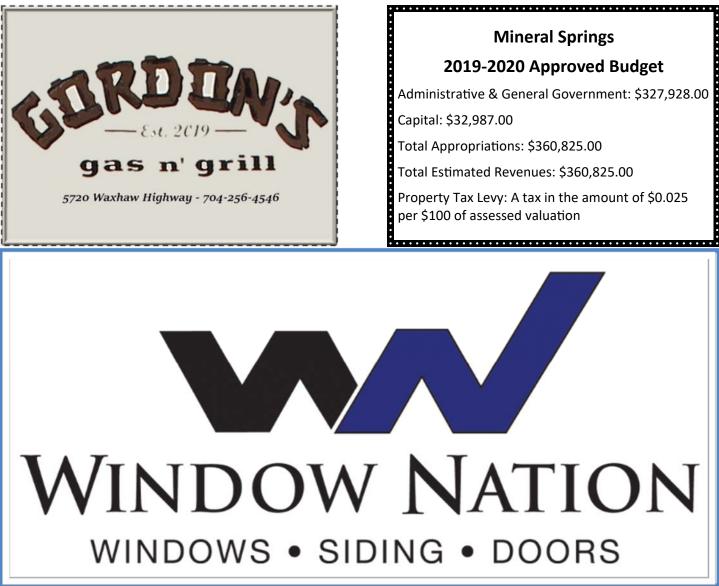

Highlights from Recent Town Council Meetings

May 9, 2019 - Town Council heard a presentation from Bart Landess of the Catawba Lands Conservancy, considered the 2019-2020 budget and called for a public hearing, passed a resolution opposing Senate Bill 367, and proclaimed May 5, 2019 to May 11, 2019 as Municipal Clerks Week.

June 13, 2019 - Town Council held a public hearing and approved the 2019-2020 budget, held a public hearing and approved a park for Western Union Community Development, heard presentations from Sheila Crunkleton of American Red Cross, Jessie Lindberg of Turning Point, Andrew Friend of Council on Aging, and approved the nonprofit contributions: Catawba Lands Conservancy - \$2,500, Council on Aging - \$2,000, American Red Cross - \$2,000, and Turning Point -\$2,000.
